# Omission Is Sin

## 1 Corinthians 11:28-31

<sup>28</sup>But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. <sup>29</sup>For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. <sup>30</sup>For this reason many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep. <sup>31</sup>For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged.
