"Ought To" Puts Others First

²¹With her enticing speech she caused him to yield, with her flattering lips she seduced him. ²²Immediately he went after her, as an ox goes to the slaughter, or as a fool to the correction of the stocks, ²³till an arrow struck his liver. As a bird hastens to the snare, he did not know it would cost his life.

"Want To" Doesn't Consider The Consequences

Proverbs 4:25-27

²⁵Let your eyes look straight ahead, and your eyelids look right before you. ²⁶Ponder the path of your feet, and let all your ways be established. ²⁷Do not turn to the right or the left; remove your foot from evil.



"Ought To" Looks Ahead

Genesis 25:31-34

³¹But Jacob said, "Sell me your birthright as of this day." 32 And Esau said, "Look, I am about to die; so what is this birthright to me?" 33Then Jacob said, "Swear to me as of this day." So he swore to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob. 34 And Jacob gave Esau bread and stew of lentils; then he ate and drank, arose, and went his way. Thus Esau despised his birthright.

"Want To" Seeks Immediate Gratification

Hebrews 11:24-27

²⁴By faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, ²⁵choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, ²⁶esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he looked to the reward. ²⁷By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king; for he endured as seeing Him who is invisible.



"Ought To" Will Delay Gratification

Philippians 3:7-8

⁷But what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ. 8Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ.
