- A Scar May Not Make A Body Part Useless (I Corinthians 15:9-10)

- Some People Are Not To Be Trusted
 2 Timothy 4:14-15; Jeremiah 9:1-6; John 2:23-25
- Some Are To Be Proven First
 I Timothy 3:10
- Trust Can Be Restored
 Acts 15:36-39; Proverbs 25:19; 24:16; 2 Timothy 4:11
