



EYES **FIXED** ON **JESUS**

LUKE 4:16-28

- He was baptized by John the Baptist (look at John 1-4 to fill the gap from that time to where we're at in this study.)
- He was tempted in the wilderness by Satan.
- He called His first followers (Andrew, Peter, Philip, & Nathanael).
- He performed His first miracle in Cana.
- He entered Jerusalem and cleansed the temple during the Passover for the first time.
- He had the well-known discussion with Nicodemus.
- He found out John was put in prison (part of the reason He will return back home).



**EYES FIXED ON JESUS**

- He speaks to the Samaritan woman at the well and others in Samaria.
- He healed the official's son in Capernaum (we are told in John 4:54, *“This was now the second sign that Jesus did when He had come from Judea to Galilee.”*).
- “And Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit to Galilee, and a report about Him went out through all the surrounding country. And He taught in their synagogues, being glorified by all.” Luke 4:14-15.
- It's been about a year since Jesus has been away from Nazareth.
