

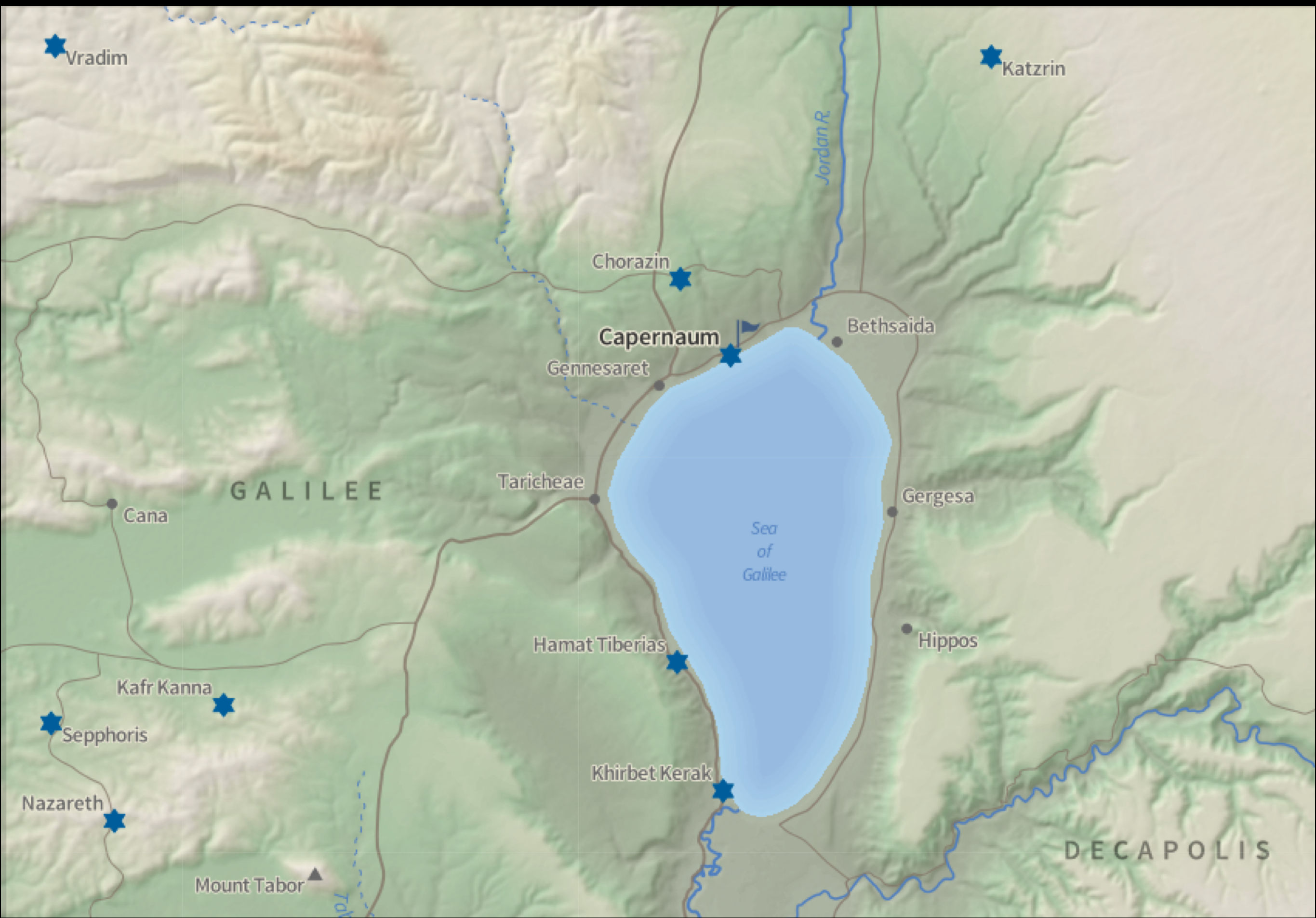


Take Heart, My Son . . .

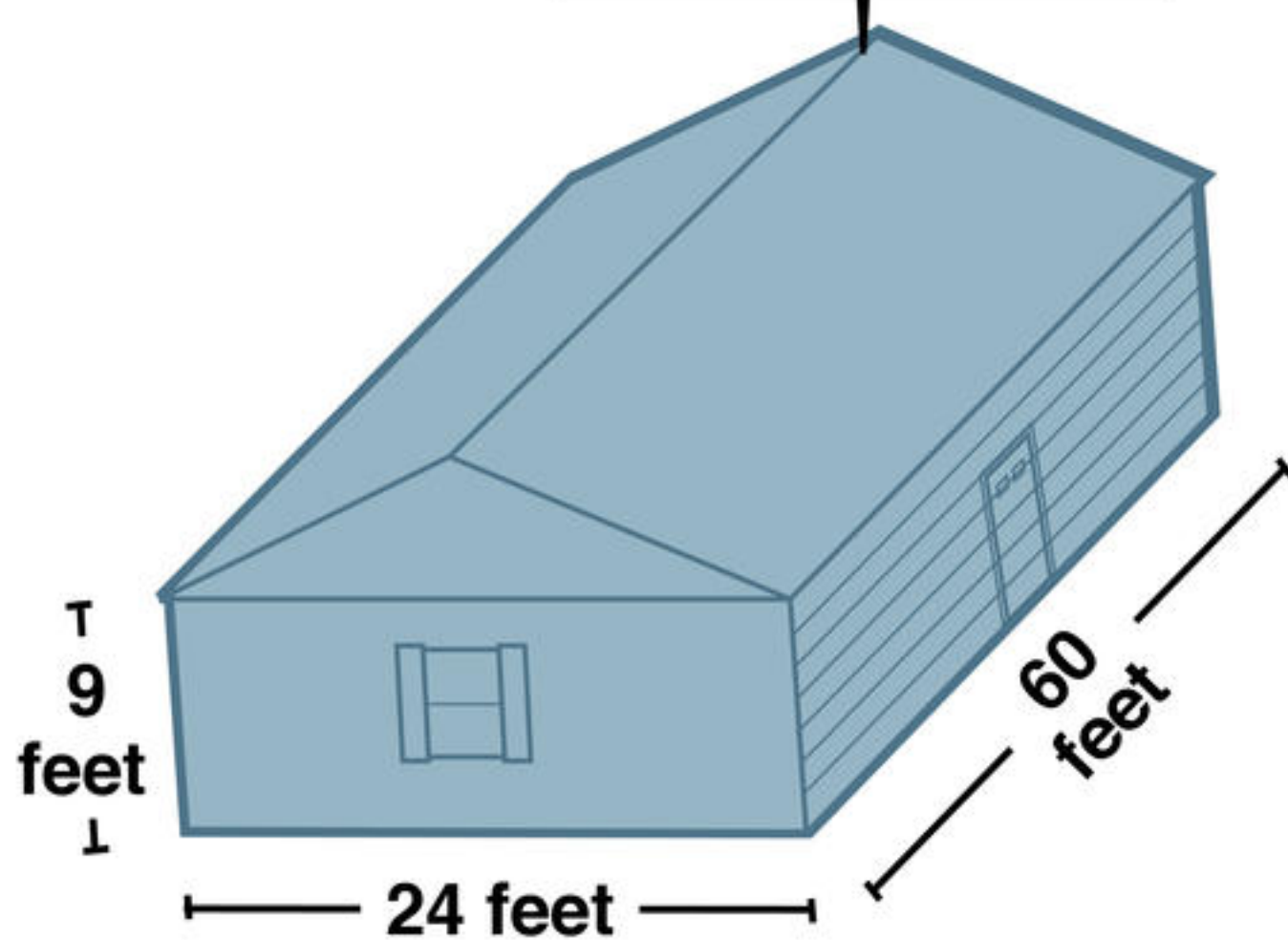

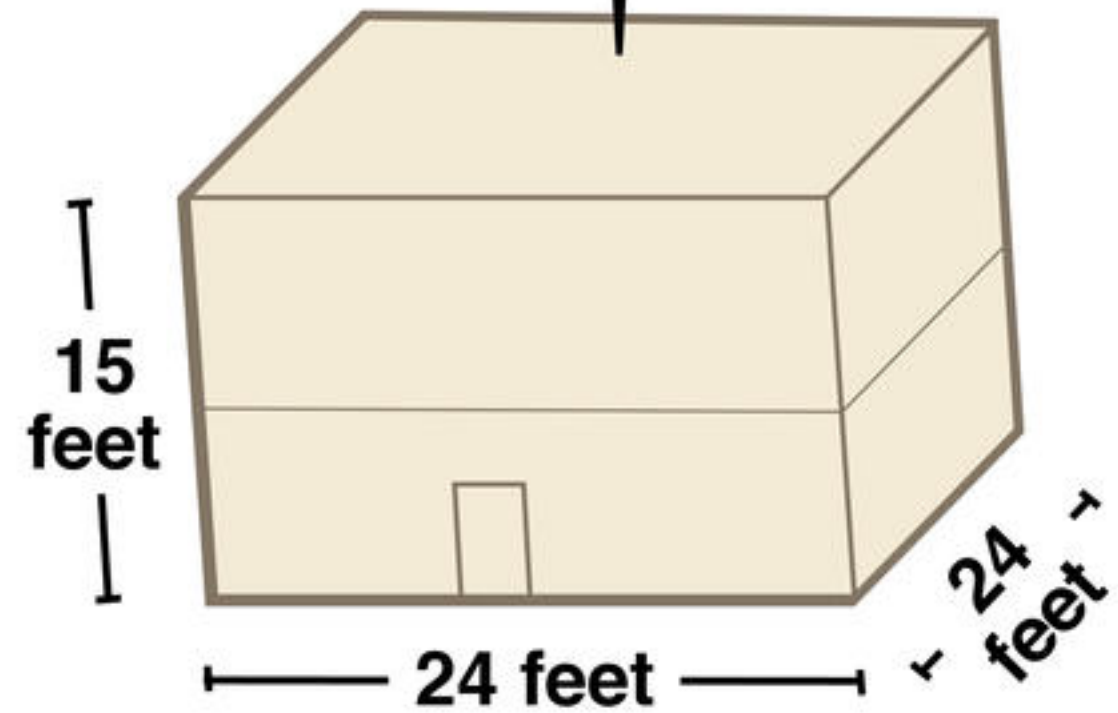


First-Century Israelite House

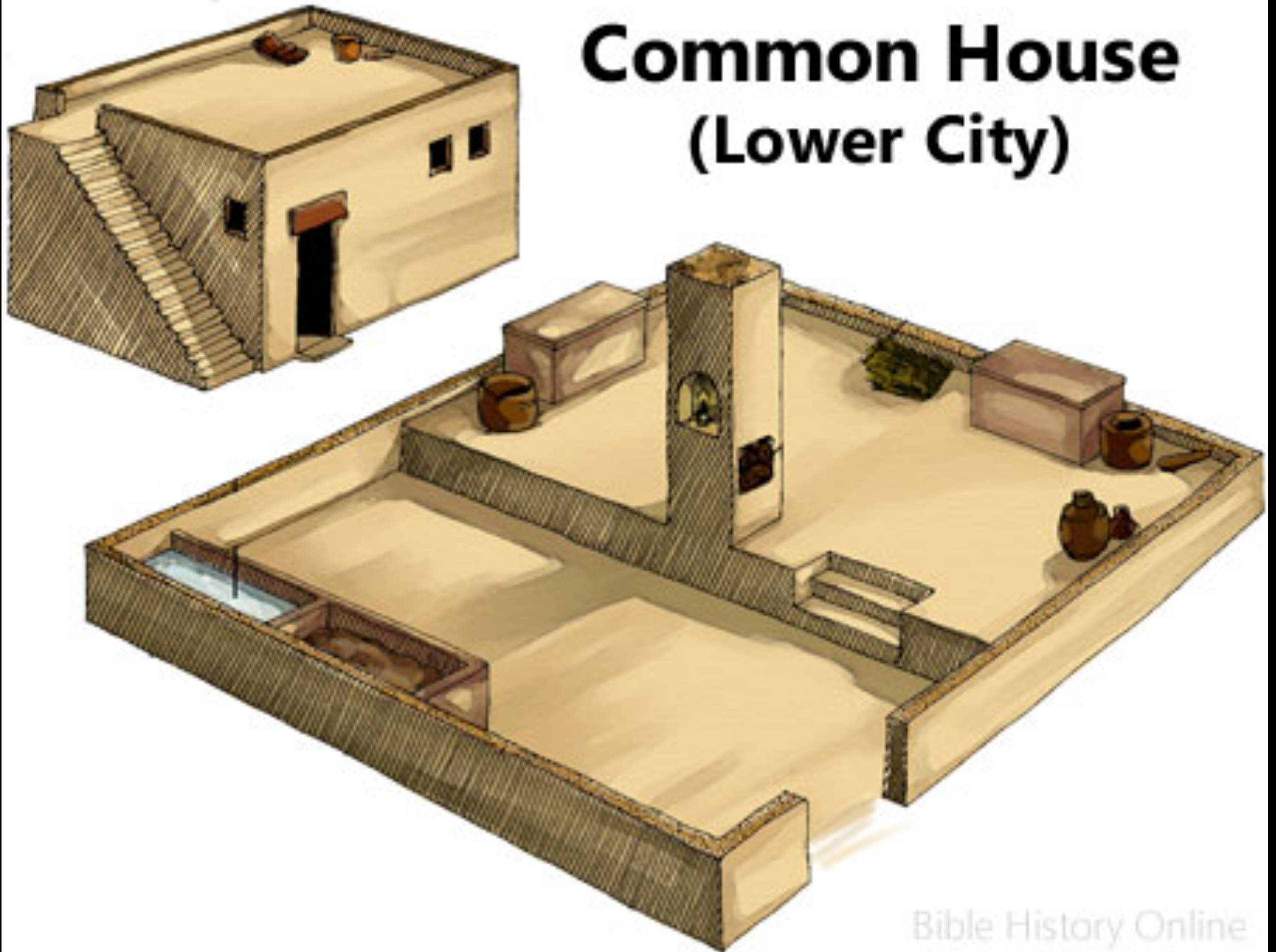

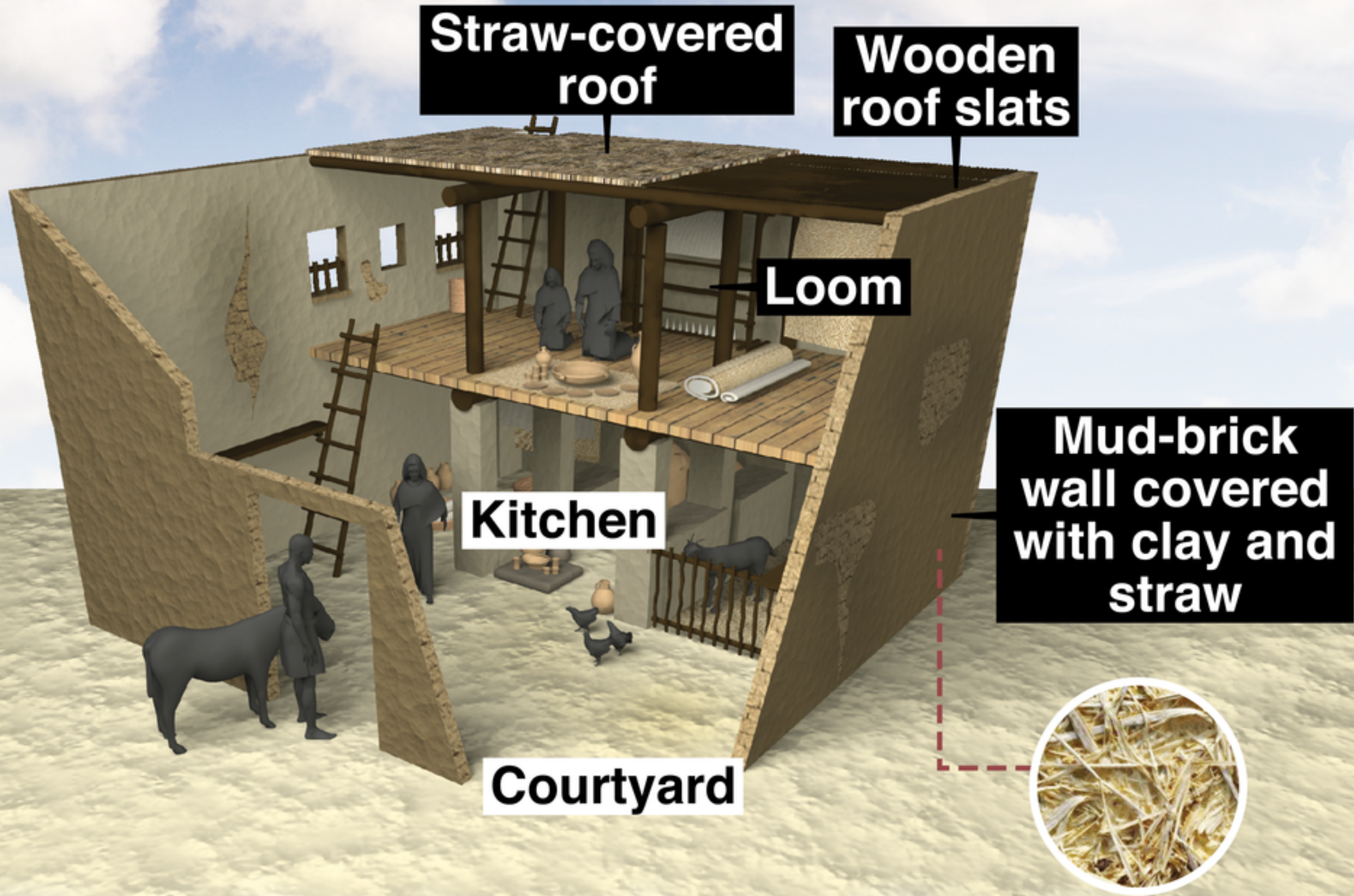
Israelite home
