Our Scripture Reading – Romans 10:1-3



Versions of the "Sinner's Prayer"...

The Billy Graham version –

Dear Lord Jesus, I know that I am a sinner, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I believe You died for my sins and rose from the dead. I turn from my sins and invite You to come into my heart and life. I want to trust and follow You as my Lord and Savior. In Your Name.

Amen

Reciting a "Sinner's Prayer"

- The idea being saved by reciting a scripted prayer.
- Denies the necessity to be baptized into Christ.
- Though some form of "baptism" may be "encouraged"...
 done sometime <u>after</u> being "saved"
 - as a "symbol", "an outward sign of an inward change"
 like a "wedding ring"

 - Again, with that "inward change" being by the person who is already "saved", by having "accepted Christ", such as through a "Sinner's Prayer".
 - No example anywhere in the Bible of an "already saved" person being baptized, for any reason.

From the First Century to now...

• It is most likely that in the Apostolic Age (the first century) when there was but "one Lord, one faith, and one baptism" (Eph 4:1-6) and no differing denominations existed, the baptism of a convert by that very act constituted him a member of the church, and at once endowed him with all the rights and privileges of full membership. In that sense, "baptism was a door into the church". Now it is different...

Authentic Conversions?

The absence of any specific examples of people praying the "Sinner's Prayer" in the Bible is also used by some to argue against it.

There are also no examples of conversions in the Bible with people praying such a prayer. Though a more prominent concern is voiced by those who say it creates within the sinner a false sense of security.

Quote - "Many assume they are saved simply because of a prayer they prayed. It's not that praying a prayer in and of itself is bad—but the question...is what kind of faith are we calling people to?"... the emphasis on the Sinner's Prayer is "unbiblical and damning." - David Platt

Authentic Conversions? Continued...

"I'm convinced that many people in our churches are simply missing the life of Christ, and a lot of it has to do with what we've sold them as the gospel, i.e. pray this prayer, accept Jesus into your heart, invite Christ into your life.

Should it not concern us that there is <u>no such superstitious</u> <u>prayer</u> in the New Testament? Should it not concern us that the Bible never uses the phrase, 'accept Jesus into your heart' or 'invite Christ into your life'?

It's not the gospel we see being preached, it's modern evangelism built on sinking sand. And it runs the risk of disillusioning millions of souls."

Actual, Biblical, Conversions

- Acts 2:36-47 those who crucified Jesus...
 - V37 "pierced to the heart"..." what shall we do?"
 - V38 "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins".
- Acts 16:25-34 Philippian Jailor...
 - V30 "what must I <u>do</u> to be saved?"
 - V33 "immediately he was baptized, he and all his family"
- Acts 8:25-39 Ethiopian Eunuch...
 - V35 "preached Jesus to him"
 - V38 Phillip "baptized him"
- Acts 22:1-16 Paul himself...
 - V10 "What shall I do, Lord?"
 - V16 "get up and be baptized, and wash away your sins"

Conclusion

- A "Sinner's Prayer" is not found in the Bible.
- We only have hope in the things that God has promised us...
 - He never promised anyone would be saved by reciting a man-made "Sinner's Prayer".
- We can't "pray our way to heaven"...
 - Cornelius Acts 10:2 "a <u>devout man</u>...who <u>feared God</u>...and <u>gave</u> <u>many alms</u>... and <u>prayed to God continually</u>".
 - Still needed to hear the gospel 10:22; had not yet heard "the words by which you will be saved" – 11:14.
 - Not saved until preached to and baptized in water 10:34-48.
- Doing things our way instead of God's way is not "faith".
- We must believe and obey <u>His</u> plan of salvation...not a convenient man-made substitute.
- We must "repent and by baptized for the remission of sins", to "wash away our sins", to be "in Christ".
 - Acts 2:38; 22:16, Mark 16:16, Rom 6:3-11, Col 2:12-13, Gal 3:26-27.

A Warning From The Word...

Matthew 7:21-23 –

"Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven. Many will say to Me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your name, and in Your name cast out demons, and in Your name perform many miracles?' And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; DEPART FROM ME, YOU WHO PRACTICE LAWLESSNESS.'
